The Supreme Court has decided that circuit court and county judges who were elected four years ago were elected for six years. This gives Judges Mason another two years to serve as county judge, and it is also contended that this applies to justices of the peace as well.

After running a few weeks the Coats Lumber Co.'s saw mill in this city had to close down again on Tuesday on account of stagnation in business, brought about by the Democratic party. Last year this saw mill gave a good pay roll to the city, which, from present indications the city will be deprived of the coming winter.

Attorney T. B. Handley left on Wednesday for Yamhill and Polk Counties to look after his political campaign in those counties. Mr. Handley is the Republican nominee for Joint Representative, and made good at the last state legislature, being highly commended by Governor West and Speaker McArthur. Mr. Handley could have been district attorney for this county, but there was a question as to whether he could accept the position, as he was one of those who voted for the law creating county attorneys, which was offered him by Governor West.

The grand jury decided on Tuesday after conferring with Judge Webster Holmes and Attorney H. T. Botts, who is acting as deputy prosecuting attorney, not to indict Attorney M. J. Gersoni, for incompetency negligence in attending to business and for gambling, it being found that some of the charges that they had preferred against the district attorney had taken place before he was appointed to that position. As it was doubtful in the minds of the Judge and Mr. Botts whether Gersoni could be convicted, the grand jury decided not to file the indictment but to take action for the recall of the district attorney.

Judge Mason and Commissioners Farmer and Sappington left on Monday morning for Portland, where they will confer with the State Highway Commission and the State Engineer with the object of obtaining some of the State money for road building in this county and to include Tillamook County in the Columbia Highway. This county has to pay its share to the state road fund, but thus far not one cent of this money has been expended here, but to improve roads in other counties. The county court, before making any recommendation in the annual budget thought it best to confer with the State Highway Commission and see for themselves what is necessary to be done with regard to connecting this county with the Columbia Highway, so that they could lay the matter before the taxpayers.
