According to official returns received by Secretary of State Olcott from all counties in the state, the constitutional amendment abolishing capital punishment was passed at the recent election by a majority of 157 votes—100,552 being cast for the measure, and 100,395 against it. Multnomah County gave the measure its biggest majority of 2377. The prohibition constitutional amendment carried by a majority of 36,480—136,482 votes being cast for it and 100,362 against.
