**Four Candidates in the Field for County Attorney.**

Secretary of State Olecott has set the date for the election to recall County Attorney M. J. Gersoni, on a petition circulated and filed by the grand jury. The date is Tuesday Dec. 29.

There are four aspirants for the office. County Attorney Gersoni will be a candidate and will ask the voters to vindicate him at the polls. The "drys" had two persons in view for the position, Attorney T. H. Goyne and Attorney George Winslow, and the selection fell on Mr. Goyne, who will be their candidate. J. Victor A. Farnell, a young attorney at Wheeler, is an aspirant, and Attorney J. R. Callahan, a graduate of Ann Arbor, Mich., who recently located in Tillamook city and intends to remain here is another aspirant who promises to devote his whole time to the office and rigidly enforce the law.

**To the Voters of Tillamook County.**

I have entered the campaign for the office of District Attorney of Tillamook County, and in order that you may know where I stand and what I intend to do if elected I respectfully submit the following statement:

The primary purpose of having a district attorney is to enforce the laws as they are on the statutes. The people by their vote at the recent election have emphatically declared that the saloon and the liquor traffic must be abolished. This law will become effective on January 1st, 1916 and the enforcement of this law will be one of the most important duties of the district attorney which you are going to elect at this election. I have entered the campaign as a candidate, with a full realization of what this law means as well as the importance of it being enforced, and with a decided determination to enforce this law and every other law, with vim and vigor, without fear or favor, and regardless of who has to stand the consequences.

Vice and immorality have no place in our society, and should I be elected, I will exercise all the powers of the district attorney's office tending toward the abolishment of these evils in all their forms, and leading to a higher and a better citizenship.

I favor strict compliance with the law pertaining to the letting of all contracts for county improvements and the handling of all public funds, and applying the same methods in conducting the affairs of the county as are applicable in our own private business.

I am absolutely independent of any cliques or factions, I have no interest to serve except the people of Tillamook County, and if elected will devote all my time and give my individual attention to the duties of the district attorney, and will demonstrate what I have advocated, namely, That prohibition will prohibit if properly and efficiently enforced, and that vice, immorality and violations of all criminal laws can be greatly lessened by a vigorous and fearless prosecution.

**May Change Court Term.**

A movement has been started among the members of the bar in Polk, Yamhill and Tillamook counties comprising the twelfth judicial district, to have the terms of the circuit court changed. It is claimed by those initiating the proposition that the terms of the court as now existing in this district do not meet the convenience of either of the lawyers or the taxpayers who are compelled to serve on the juries.

A bill is now being drawn up and will be presented early in the coming session of the legislature by W. T. Vinton, senator elect of Yamhill county. It will have an emergency clause attached, so that, if passed, it will become immediately effective. The bill will provide for three terms of court in each county, but the time of holding them will be as follows:

Polk county—In January, April and October, instead of in February, August and November.

Yamhill county—In February, June, and November, instead of March, September and December.

Tillamook county—In March, July, and December, instead of April and November.
