The situation presents a promising utlook for the welfare of the state. If party government and party responsiility are the strong influences for eficiency in government that econoasits represent them to be there will he less friction between the Execuive and state officers, less combativness exhibited between Governor nd Legislature and more accomplishd in the succeeding four years in onstructive administration and legisation than in the entire period during

which so much sparring for political dvantage and personal aggrandizenent was exhibited.

The Governor's message left a disinctly pleasant impression with the nembers of the Legislature, the state fficers, the visiting city and business epresentatives, and the throng of itizens in the lobby. The part genrally accepted as the keynote of the ddress and of his administrative olicy was the plan offered for cenralizing state departments and such ther advice as may be classified vithin an economy program.

In this respect Governor Withycombe is not a radical when measur d with some of the members of the Iouse and Senate. He did not suggest o many changes as are mentioned in he resolution presented in the Senate y Senator Barrett, and which has the backing of numerous leaders in the pper house. Even this resolution loes not cut so deep into the tangled cnot of boards and commissions as some profess a willingness to sink the cnife.

The impression left at the close of he second day, when practically all een heard from tentatively or offici-Ily, is that the Legislature will not ndeavor to see how little it can do ind keep faith with the people, but low much it can accomplish without joing to extremes.
