Scientists who have been studying the question declare that a lot of sullen, suspicious dispositions are developed as a result of unreasonable discipling of children. If you are severe in the matter of punishing your child, you should have a care.

It is pointed out that a little child knows nothing of right and wrong, and that early training is designed to help it tell the good from the bad. Punishment, it is declared, is the poorest and the most effective means to this end. Example counts for much. The parent who keeps his temper with his child will find the child disposed to imitate him. Kindness and patience in the father or mother is likely to encourage like traits in the child. Flashes of temper in the parent often kindle rebellion in the little one.

Parents are warned especially against scolding and "nagging". It is necessary to be firm, at times, and in order to retain the respect of the child the parent must avoid being "fussy" and giving to finding fault over trifles. "Everything goes well," he said, 'and along comes the agent for a big city corporation, who starts to boost the prices, paying the farmers about twice what they are getting at the cooperation plant. The natural result is that the farmers sell their milk to the city chap and the co-operative establishment is forced to close up. Then as soon as it is closed, down go the prices. It has been ruination to the small creamery and has brought dispair to the heart of many a farmer."


