COURT IS SUSTAINED.

It's Up to the County Court Where Road Money is to be Expended.

In answer to the communication sent Attorney General Brown in regard to Attorney General Brown in regard to the County Court being allowed to change the budget after listening to citizens at the taxpayer's meeting, Mr. Brown had decided that the court can do so and expend the money wherever it pleases. Some of the timber men raised an objection to the county court increasing the amount of money for the Bayocean road from \$3,000 to \$10,250. They contended that this could not be done. Bayocean did not get a square deal when the county court and the advisory committee met, for most every part of the county was represented, but Bayocean had no one to represent or advocate its claims for a road and a way out. There is some doubt as to what the present County Court will do with the road budget as finally decided upon by the previous county court, but the general consensus of opinion is that it would be the wisest policy for the court to go ahead and carry out the work to completion.

Dear Sir:—I beg to acknowledge receipt of your favor of the 16th instant, enclosing a certified copy of the record of the County Court of Tillamook County, in the matter of repairing a budget for the 1914 tax bill, and propounding the questions: "Suppose that in computing what the budget should be, the county court had figured \$10,000.00 for a bridge at a certain place in the county at such item was not specifically mentioned in the budget, but was included in the lump sum as appears in the published budget, could the county court appropriate the money intended for such bridge, and expend on some other project?"

Answering, I would say that a reference to the budget as shown by the copy of the record, so far as it relates to bridges, reveals the fact that the estimate for all road purposes was included in one item, as follows: "ROAD PURPOSES—Bridges, Superintendents' Salaries Repairs Machinery and supplies \$172,000." It will be seen that there is no specific item made for any particular bridge, but all roads, bridges and expenses connected therewith,

are included in the one item to cover all of such purposes.

The County Court in making the estimate for and levy of taxes for county purposes, acts judicially and not ministerially, and therefore speaks only by its record. (Pacific Bridge Co. vs. Clackamas County, 45 Federal 217, 218; Stout vs. Yamhill County, 30 Oregon, 314, 319; 11 CYC 762, 763; Section 946, Lord's Oregon Laws.)

Therefore any item which is not included in the budget, although it may have been considered as an expense going to make up the more general item which was afterward included in the budget as a part of the basis upon which the county taxes were thereafter levied, is not a specific part of the budget.

The principle is well settled in 37 CYC, at page 975, as follows: "The record of a levy of taxes is the best evidence of it; the recitals are conclusive and parole evidence cannot be received to prove such levy unless the previous existence of the record, and its loss or destruction, is established."

Citing numerous authorities.

In the present instance, there is no previous record, or its loss, established, but the record of the estimate required by statute, (Chapter 342, page 478, Laws of 1913), is complete, showing the total sum of all road and bridge purposes, and no specific item for any particular road or bridge improvement.

Depending upon the record thereof or as showing the facts of the estimate upon which the taxes were levied, the County Court is not limited thereby to the expenditure of the funds received for such purposes to any particular improvement for road or bridge purposes, but may expend the same for any road or bridge purpose within the discretion allowed the Court under the statute providing for the improvement, repair, etc. of roads and highways and the construction and maintenance of bridges.

Notice to Farmers.

The Tillamook Lime Products Co., is ready to furnish ground lime stone to the farmers. The lime stone is ground so as to pass a 1-6 inch wire screen.

The lime stone will cost \$5.00 per ton in sacks at the plant. A charge of 3 cents per sack or 60c. per ton extra will be made for the sacks unless sacks are furnished by the customer. Only grain or meal sacks with a close weave should be brought as the fine dust or powder will all be lost if the sacks have a coarse weave leaving only the coarse grains of limestone in the sacks.

A set of new grinding rollers are being installed to increase the capacity and produce a finer product.
