## VIRGEL'S WILL CONTESTED.

Petitioner Alleges her Husband Was Influenced When Mentally and Physically Sick.

A suit has been filed in the circuit court by Mrs. Caroline A. Virgel to contest the will of her husband E. H. Virgel, who died at Woods, in Tillamook County, on the 20th of February, 1914, who at the time of his death had an estate consisting of a large amount of money and real and personal property. William M. Ladd, Charles E. Ladd, Newton McCoy, E. E. Virgel, Lucy Drew, Rosa Haines, A. W. Lambert and Edith L. Pike are named as defendants in the suit. That at the time of the death of E. H. Virgel the complaint states that the petitioner was his wife and only heir at law. On the 3rd of April 1914, the defendants filed a will with these provisions:

The executors were to sell all property at auction and convert same into money, except such as were specified. Having herebefore giving his will \$30,000 and given her an auto worth \$1,500 and built her a garage worth \$557.00, the last of which was intended as compensation for her care and nursing her husband while sick at various times, deemed her amply provided for, so bequeathed her one dollar and no more.

Bequeathed to his niece, Mrs. Edith Pike, \$6,000 and all his household furniture, and his residence property in Tillamook County, with the exception of 50 by 100 feet, which is given to A. W. Lambert.

To his brother, B. F. Virgel, he gave \$6,000.

To his sister, Lucy Drew, he bequeathed \$1,000.

To his cousin, Mrs. Rosa Haines \$1,000 and a large gold finger ring.

To his friends, William M. Ladd \$10,000 and Attorney Newton McCoy \$10,000.

All the rest, residence and remainder of the property to be sold and divided amongst the legatees and devisees pro rata, also his automobile to be placed in the Franklin Garage in Portland and sold at private sale.

William M. Ladd and Charles E. Ladd and Newton McCoy were named as executors.

The complaint alleges that E. H. Virgel was 85 years of age and was for more than four years prior to his death had been sick and infirm and suffering from paralysis and nervous disorder and from mental and physical ailments and sickness of many kinds and that by reason thereof he lost his mind and memory and was unable to carry on a conversation correctly upon any subject whatsoever and was unable to manage, control or care for his property or care for himself, and during all of said time was as helpless as a child and dependent upon the care of his wife. He did not have sufficient mind or memory to know the value of his real or personal property; that more than four years prior to his death he had deposited his money in Ladd & Tilton Bank, managed by W. M. Ladd and C. E. Ladd, and that those defendants were not personal friends, but were financial leaders; that Newton McCoy was the decedent's confidential attorney and advisor and was of confidence and trust as long as the decedent was of sufficient mind and memory to transact any business for himself; that William M. Ladd was the largest owner and holder in the Ladd & Tilton Bank and Ladd estate.

The complaint further alleges that when the will was executed E. H. Virgel was so sick and paralyzed and nervous that he was unable to make or execute it and was wholly and absolutely a helpless instrument in the cunning and designing hands of the defendants, W. M. Ladd and Newton McCoy, and that Virgel was entirely under their control and subject to their influence, suggestions, dictation when he made and devised the said alleged and intended will for the purpose of wrongfully cheating and defrauding the petitioner out of the property and estate which is valued at \$125,000.00.
