

BLACK SILKS AND SATINS.

VIRGEL'S WILL CONTESTED

Petitioner Alleges her Husband Was Influenced When Mentally and Physically Sick.

A suit has been filed in the circuit court by Mrs. Caroline A. Virgel to contest the will of her husband E.H. Virgel, who died at Woods, in Tills mook County, on the 20th of Febraary, 1914, who at the time of his death had an estate consisting of a large amount of money and real and personal property. William M. Lad Charles E. Ladd, Newton McCoy, B. E. Virgel, Lucy Drew, Rosa Hains, A. W. Lambert and Edith L. File are named as defendants in the suit That at the time of the death of E.H. Virgel the complaint states that the petitioner was his wife and only ber at law. On the 3rd of April 1914 the defendants filed a will with the provisions:

The executors were to sell all proerty at auction and convert same into money, except such as were specified

Having herebefore giving his will \$30,000 and given her an auto worth \$1,500 and built her a garage work \$557.00, the last of which was intended ed as compensation for her care and nursing her husband while sick a various times, deemed her amply provided for, so bequeathed her a dollar and no more.

Bequeathed to his niece, Mrs. Edit Pike, \$6,000 and all his househo furniture, and his residence property in Tillamook County, with the exemtion of 50 by 100 feet, which is give to A. W. Lambert.

To his brother, B. F. Virgel, i gave \$6,000. To his sister, Lucy Drew, held

The complaint alleges that El Virgel was 85 years of age and m for more than four years prior to h death had been sick and infirm a suffering from paralysis and nem disorder and from mental and pipe cal ailments and sickness of mar kinds and that by reason thereof in lost his mind and memory and n unable to carry on a conversa correctly upon any subject whater and was unable to manage, con or care for his property or care himself, and during all of said time was as helpless as a child and t pendent upon the care of his w did not have sufficient mind memory to know the value of his or personal property; that years prior to his death he had posited his money in Ladd & Ta Bank, managed by W. M. Ladd C. E. Ladd, and that those defents were not personal friends, but it dotage Virgel thought they financial leaders; that Newton Coy was the decedents confide attorney and advisor and wot confidence and trust as long Bl cedent was of sufficient mind memory to transact any business himself; that William M. Laddis largest owner and holder in the & Tilton Bank and Ladd estate

The complaint further alleges when the will was executed E Virgel was so sick and palsied paralysed and nervous that ht unable to make or execute it and wholly and absolutely a helples strument in the cunning and do ing hands of the defendants, Ladd and Newton McCoy, and Virgel was entirely under their trol and subject to their infinite suggestions, dictation when he and devised the said alleged and tended will for the purpose of sta ing cheating and defrauding the tioner out of the property and of which is valued at \$125,000.00.
