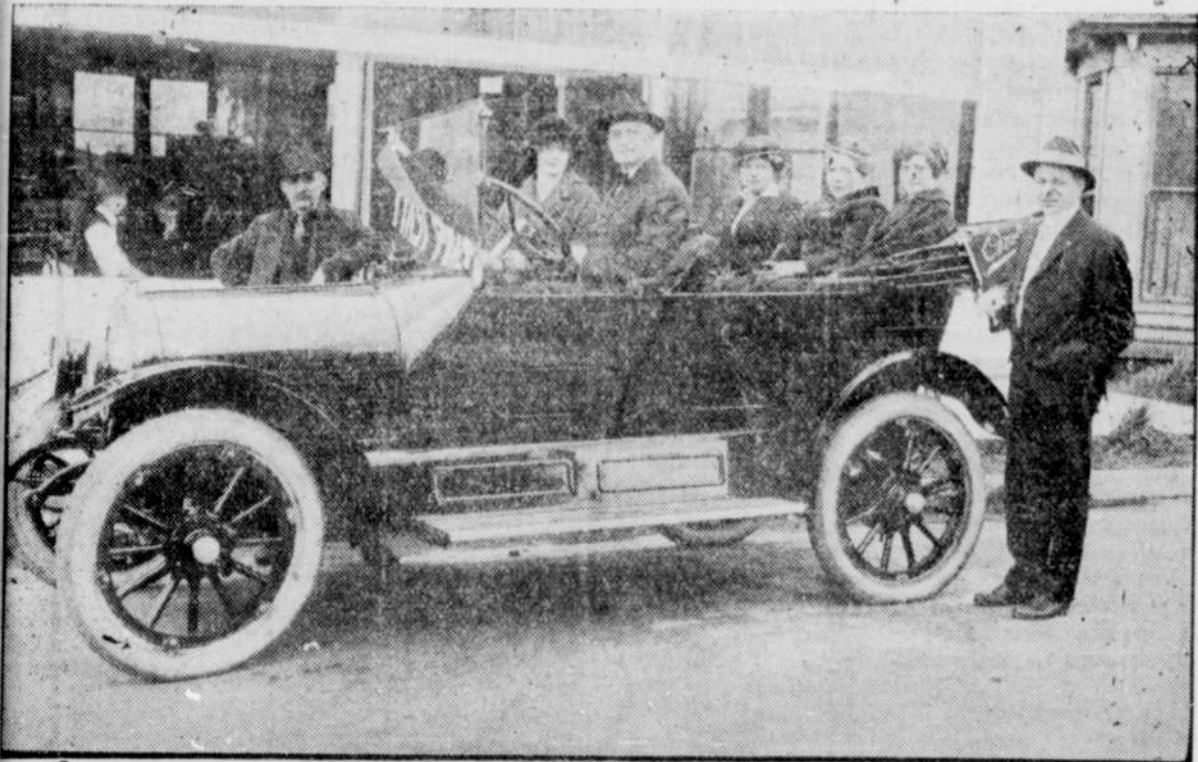




CONTEST CLOSES SATURDAY.
