Drowned in Trask River.

Another sad drowning occurred on Sunday, when Harry Nelson lost his life in Trask river at the Earl place. In company with a number of young friends Nelson went boating on the river, and when in about three feet of water the boat capsized, throwing the occupants into the water, and it was while wading in the river that Nelson seems to have slipped into a deep hole and disappeared. His companions immediately pulled him out, but it is thought that the shock caused heart failure. He was a good swimmer, and was the cheese maker at the Long Prairie factory. Dr. Wendt was called, and an effort, extending over two hours, was made to restore life, but of no avail. The deceased was a son of Axel Nelson, of Cloverdale, and was aged 25 yrs., 9 mo., and 22 days. He was a young man greatly respected in the community and his untimely death is greatly deplored. The body was removed to Hebo where it was buried on Monday.
