It is about four years since the snap shot man autoed in the Willamette valley, and we want to congratulate each county for the progress they have made in road building, especially Yamhill and Polk counties. The latter county has some fine oiled highways and it is a pleasure to motor around Dallas and that beautiful county with its diversified farming. All up through the Willamette valley the roads are good, and south of the divide some fine grading have been done in the mountains and through canyons. Approaching Medford one meets the hard surfaced county roads to Ashland, which is partly concrete. More we see of the two materials, more firmly are we convinced that bitulithic is the most economical of the two and best for horses. It may have been a little premature to have put down so much hard surfaced county road, but when maintenance charges are considered and the great demand for better roads taken into consideration, we look at the matter from an economical standpoint, just as we do a hard surfaced highway through Tillamook County. Now as to the auto travel. There is a tremendous auto travel between Oregon and California this year. One cannot travel but a short distance but what they pass autos of all descriptions, had a large number from the East, Rocky Mountain and Middle States was a great surprise. They greet one with a cheery disposition and it was a pleasure to meet them, for they were out to see the United States first and appeared highly pleased with Oregon. Everyone along the route have been benefited directly or indirectly, by the auto travel this year. Hotels have done a good business and garages have been well patronized. A large amount of money is being left every day in the larger cities on the route, by the tourists, and from what we can learn the travel will be greater as the roads become better, for a trip to California by auto makes a most enjoyable outing. This is travel that every county we passed through is catering to, for it means a whole lot of new money dropped every day in their midst by people who are out for enjoyment and a good time, and if they can get it, a few dollars extra expense don't cut much figure. Good roads and good hotels are what they want. We hope before another season opens the black mark against Tillamook County will be removed and the Hebo road made fit to travel over, and with the Bayocean road also finished in time for next season, it will surprise everybody the large amount of tourists who will come to Tillamook and the large amount of money left in Tillamook county. It is up to the County Court to get a move on next year as soon as possible and get the Dolph-Hebo and Bayocean roads completed.
