SCHOOL SPELLING CONTEST.

County School Superintendent W. S. Buel Gives Rules Governing Same.

I hereby give complete details for carrying out the County Spelling Contest, which was presented to you through the papers of the county some days ago.

The contests will be given on four different dates and will include review as well as future contests. The dates for the four contests are as follows: First contest, February 4th; Second contest, March 3rd;

The words for these contests will be selected from Rick's Champion Spelling Book and mailed the teachers from this office.

The pupils shall write these words with pen and ink, on legal cap paper. At the head of the manuscript should be given the name, grade, and school district number, of each pupil.

Pupils that misspell the least number of words, for the four contests, shall be declared the representative from their district for the grade to which they belong.

Each district in the county will be privileged to have as many representatives at these try-outs as they have grades in the school. One may enter the try-out contest for the grade to which he belongs.

Due notice will be given to each teacher, stating the exact dates for the local try-outs and the championship contest. The place of meeting and the districts included in each section will also be given at the same time.

The words for these contests will be selected uniformly, for each grade, from the section of the speller, which is designated as grade work for each grade, as shown by the "Oregon State Course of Study."

The words for the Championship Contest will be selected from the same book and each grade will begin with lesson one. The words will be pronounced consecutively until the final contest for that grade is decided.

The words for the contest for high school pupils will be selected from "Minimum Requirements, Lists in Spelling and in Correct Usage for the Schools of Oregon."

The following contests will be held at the same time for the benefit of students not attending school: First, for those who have not completed the eighth grade.

Second, for those who have completed the eighth grade. The words for this class will be the same as for the high school. These books are in the hands of the teachers and any one desiring to enter this contest is requested to copy the words from the book.

Teachers are requested to pronounce these words for these separate classes on the same date as the other contests are given. The papers should be marked non-attending pupils and grade or high school, as the case may be.

We shall provide liberal prizes for the champions of each grade at the final contest. The amounts of these prizes will be given at a later date.
