Funeral Services.

The funeral services over the remains of J. H. Dunstan took place on Friday morning at the Christian Church, conducted by the Rev. H. A. Van Winkle, when a large number of sympathizing friends and neighbors attended to pay their last tribute of respect to the deceased, there being a large number of Grangers present. The interment was in the Oddfellows Cemetery.

The deceased was born at Mineral Point, Wis., on August 23, 1863 and at the time of his death was aged 52 years, 6 months and 6 days. He came to Oregon in 1890, and in company with his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Dunstan, located at Corvallis, where they remained one year. From Corvallis they moved to a farm near Dundee, Yamhill county, and in 1892 came to Tillamook, where he has since resided. He married Miss Fannie Booker on January 22, 1894. He was elected to the office of county surveyor of Iowa County, Wis., at the age of 25 years. He was a member of the Christian Church of this city at the time of his death, also president of the County Fair Board. He leaves a wife, father and mother and a daughter, Mrs. Maurice Bayes, and a large number of friends, who deplore his untimely death.

The funeral services of Mrs. Julia E. Henkle, who was a daughter of the late Captain Paul Schrader, took place on Sunday, the interment being in the Oddfellows' cemetery. The services were held at the home of the deceased, which was attended by a large delegation from the Rebecca and Eastern Star lodges. On Friday Otto Schrader, brother of deceased arrived from Venice Cal., and the other out of town relatives were Mrs. R. L. Henkle, of Philomath, Ore., mother of the bereaved husband, and a brother C. W. Henkle of Independence; and Frank Schrader, of Venice California.

The deceased, Mrs. Julia Henkel, was born near Salem, Ore., Feb. 24, 1845, and was the daughter of Captain and Mrs. Paul Schrader. She resided with her parents also in Newport and Astoria, previous to coming to Tillamook in 1893. She was married to Roy N. Henkle, Dec. 11, 1912, and was the mother of two children. Deceased was taken suddenly ill and died on Tuesday morning, Feb. 29, having attained the age of 71 years. She leaves a husband and two children, Elma and Willis; her mother, Mrs. Paul Schrader; a sister Mrs. E. J. Schilling, and two brothers Otto and Frank Schrader to mourn their loss. The deceased was beloved by all who knew her, for she was extremely kind and considerate, her father having great confidence in her while he was alive. The death of Captain Schrader was a great shock to the family, and in the sudden demise of this beloved member of the family, this makes another sad bereavement for the distressed family to endure. Having spent her girlhood and young womanhood days in Tillamook she had many dear and close friends who are saddened by her early death. The bereaved family have the sympathy of the people of this city in their sad bereavement.
