The Oregon direct primary law is being discussed quite freely in many quarters this spring, and in much of this discussion there is convert insinuation that the law ought to be repealed. Desire for repeal, of course, is predicted on the assumption of return to the old convention system of making nominations for public office. The undoubtedly has many faults. From the cold and dispassionate standpoint of ultimate results it is less efficient than the old method, for many of those who are best fitted to serve the public do not take part in primary elections. Running for office has become an expensive and nerve-racking process, for a campaign has to be extended over nearly a year's time. This discourages many good men who might otherwise be candidates. It is also more expensive, as taxpayers are learning to their cost. It provides for payment from the public purse of a large list of expenses that were formerly borne by private contributions, and as a result election bills are running up to a high total. The entire cost of the primary election is added to the taxes, and this amounts to a material increase.-Oregon Register.
