Judge Gatens has refused the receiver for Bayocean to put in a bid for the completion of the Bayocean road on the ground that it would be illegal to do so, as the bid that was intended to be made would entail a loss to the T. B. Potter, Kealty Co., now in the hands of a receiver. This has placed the County Court in a quandry to know what is best to do. The estimate of the work to be done amounts to nearly \$30,000 according to the figures of the county engineer. There is now about \$18,000 available for this work. Unless the Bayocean peo, le come through it is probable this work will be delayed. The County Court was anxious to have the matter settled, for it is convinced that Bayocean is entitled to a road and a way out. It is hard to tell what the County Court will do.

Accident in Logging Camp.

On Tuesday afternoon while Oscar Monson was falling timber at the Burton Logging Camp near Hobsonville, he met with an accident that cost him his life. As a tree was about to fall he called to his partner to jump out of the way, and Monson did the same thing, but after the tree had fallen he was found on the ground with a bad gash in the head, which rendered him unconscious. It seems he was struck on the head by a large limb which had broken off. He was brought to this city and taken to Dr. Boals' hospital where he died, never gaining consciousness. He was about 32 years of age and unmarried.

Sour Grass Road to be Rocked.

At a meeting of the County Courts of Tillamook and Yamhill counties in this city on Tuesday, the successful and lowest bidder for rocking the Sour Grass road, were Arthur P. Starr, Louie C. Muscott, James V. Chitty and Joe Tito, which will amount to about \$15,000. The other bidders were F. E. Hobson, H. M. Hoskins and Sam McVey and Tillamook Bay Construction Co.

Tillamook Bay Construction Co.—For rock placed from the Yamhill quarry, \$2.50 per cu. yd.; from Baxter quarry \$2.20; from Pearson quarry \$2.00.

Arthur P. Starr, Louie C. Muscott, James P. Chitty and Joe Tito—From Yamhill quarry \$2.18; from Baxter quarry \$1.90; from Pearson quarry, \$2.65.

F. E. Hobson, H. M. Hoskins and Sam McVey—From Yamhill quarry, \$2.84; from Baxter quarry, \$1.90; from Pearson quarry, \$2.89.

It is estimated that the work for rocking the road will amount to \$15,000, besides other expenses.
