It having come to my knowledge that you are a candidate for the State Senate I take great pleasure in saying that at the last session of the Legislature you were one of the determined, active men who assisted in



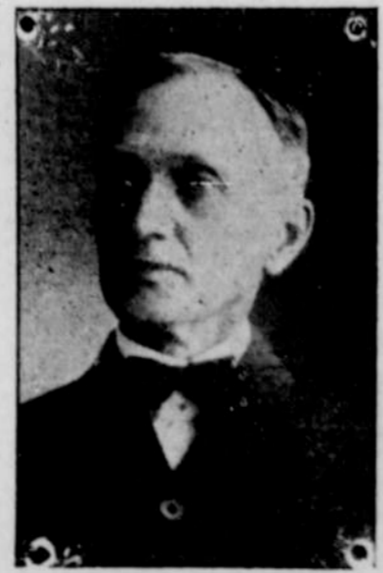
