The injunction suit filed by the United Railway Company against Bay City will be taken up before Judge Bagley on Friday morning, and Mr. Callahan will represent the city.

The Coroner Dr. Wendt was called to Manzanita on Monday, having been notified that a man had been drowned there. The man's name was John A. Allen, who was care taker of the Manzanita club house, and was drowned in outlet of Classic Ridge Lake. Evidently the man had committed suicide, and this was confirmed by finding a note in the club rooms stating that he intended drowning himself at the place where the body was found. It is thought that he was about 65 years old.

A petition was sent to Governor Withycombe asking him to release T. B. Turney, who has a fine hanging over him for exposing obscene pictures. As the Governor is exceedingly careful about paroling prisoners, and remitting fines, it is not likely that he will do so in this case, for he has made a rule that he will do this only on the recommendation of the judge who tried the case, the district attorney and the sheriff. As the officials refuse to make a recommendation, there is no way out for Turney, but to pay the fine or go to jail.

A large delegation of settlers, are in the city today from Hebo, and this afternoon appeared before the County Court in behalf of the Three Rivers road. They contend that the Hebo appropriated for the road from \$8,000 not being expended there and they are demanding that the County Court expend the money on that road. They claim that the Three River road has a good grade and it needs to be graded. They also appear to be opposed to the proposed Little Nestucca road which they claim makes an addition of ten miles in the route into this county and will cost over \$100,000.

Another Fatal Accident at Burton's Logging Camp.

Another fatal accident occurred at Burton's logging camp near Hobsonville on Wednesday, when the lower part of the body of Edward Lyster was mashed together. He was working at the chute, and although no one was a witness to the accident it is thought that he slipped and fell into the chute. When he was seen last he was standing on a log at the end of the chute, and two large logs coming down soon after he was crushed to death between them, the lower part of the body from the waist down being mashed together. Dr. Boals and Dr. Wendt, the coroner were notified, but the latter being out of town, Justice of the Peace Stanley accompanied by Sheriff Crenshaw went to the scene of the accident to make an investigation, but Mr. Stanley did not think it desirable to hold an inquest. The body was brought to this city. The deceased was a brother of T. W. Lyster, of South Prairie, and was unmarried. He was a fine appearing young man 35 years of age, and was greatly liked by his fellow workmen.

Garibak's Property Sold.

C. A. Johnson has disposed of his Garibaldi property which includes 100 acres at the mouth of the Miami river. It was sold to the Whitney Co., and the consideration was \$15,000. The company will take possession of 40 acres of the property at once and the remainder in the fall. It is reported that the property was bought for millinery purposes and that a large saw mill will be erected there.
