Let the slogan of every voter in he coming national election be: "A speedy repeal of the Underwood Tarff law, and the enactment in its place of a tariff law that will restore the American labor and industry their full rights in the American market."

An adequate protective tariff means Oregon. o the workers in America potteries vill not be obliged to compete with he same class of workers in Japan at 34 cents a day for eleven hours work. Pottery workers, keep your eyes open and plaster free trade to your learts' desire.

The fact that in the first ten nonths of the Underwood free trade ariff our imports increased nearly \$102,000,000, while our exports decreased nearly \$159,000,000, is an experience of the control of th rrefutable argument that the war is solely the cause of the present stimulation of trade in the United States.

In the columns of a free trade conemporary there is an interesting summary of the German exports to his country. With all the restrictions of war, the mighty British fleet being he chief, Germany sends us more han \$100,000 worth of shipments a nonth. If the soldiers were back at work, and the British fleet were at seace, and the tariff were left as it is, where would our home market be?

The "nonpartisan" racket is being overworked in behalf of the Wilson administration. First we had the nonpartisan tariff commission project, ntended to furnish an alibi for the administration on the Underwood ariff law. Now Ambassador Morgenthau, a partisan adherent of the present administration, is promoting a "nonpartisan" league to promote the randidacy of President Wilson for re-

President Wilson professes to be for "America First," yet when Con-gress had an opportunity to vote on a measure that would insure the es-ablishment and development of dye-stuffs industry in this country and thus make us independent of Ger-many in that respect, Wilson uttered not one word in its behalf. The Democrais defeated the measure, following the theory of President Wilson that a protective tariff is an economic error. "America First" indeed.

Senator Broussard of Louisiana, is one Democrat who does not hesitate to declare his advocacy of a protective tariff. He gave an interview few days ago in which he predicted that there will be a revision of the tariff, and along upward lines. He does not pretend to believe that this will be for revenue, merely, but open-ly admits that it must be for protec-tion purposes. He knows how the Louisiana sugar industry was hit be-fore the war began and has heard from the voters of the state.






