In re: S. Stiverson vs. George Stiverson is a divorce suit filed in the circuit court. These parties were married at Cloverdale in August 12th, 1912, two children being born to the union. The grounds for the divorce, as set forth in the complaint, are cruel and inhuman treatment and the personal indignities showered by the defendant on the plaintiff rendered her life burdensome; that this cruel treatment began a few weeks after they were married and have lasted continuously until June, 1916, when plaintiff left her husband, taking the two children. The complaint recites a large number of cases of cruel treatment. The plaintiff asks that she be given the custody of the children and the decree provide that the plaintiff be paid \$20.00 per month for the support of the children.

Bay City Land Co. vs. Bay City is a case filed in the circuit court in which the plaintiff seeks to enjoin and restrain the defendants from proceeding with the sale of the company's property as advertised; and to enjoin and restrain the defendants from making any sale under the warrant issued for the assessment pending the determination of the suit, and that a decree be entered that the proceeding had and taken by Bay City for the assessment of any portion of the cost of the improvement of the road and highway in the complaint against plaintiff's property, or any part thereof, is null and void; that Bay City has no claim or lien against any of plaintiff's property because of improvements herein mentioned, or because of any proceedings had in attempting to assess plaintiff's property for any part of the cost of improvement, and perpetually to enjoin and restrain Bay City from selling or threatening to sell any portion of plaintiff's property for any attempted assessments for the part of the cost of the improvements to Fourth Street.

1st.—Eighth Street, from the East line of Stillwell Avenue, East to the West line of Block 10 in A. A. Miller's Addition.
2nd.—Fifth Avenue East, from the South side of Third Street to the North side of Eighth Street.
3rd.—Fifth Street, from the center of Sixth Avenue East, East to the East boundary of Tillamook City.
4th.—Fifth Street, from the East line of Second Avenue East to the center of Sixth Avenue East, and Third Avenue East from Fourth Street to Fifth Street.
