


TIMBER LAND WORTH \$5,000,000 TO BE SOLD.

Timber land valued at more than \$5,000,000 and covered with 4,500,-000 feet of the finest Douglas fir in the Wilson river country will be transferred from the Tillamook Timber & Logging company to the First Trust & Savings bank, of Chicago, trustees for the bondholders of that Judge Bean will sign this afternoon. for \$3,276,606, which swamped company when, in September, 1915, it found itself unable to pay its taxes and the semi-annual interest of \$90,-000 on its bonds. 


