### DAHLIA PARADE.

Queen of the Dahlias to be Elected by Popular Vote.

At a meeting of the Women's Civic Improvement League on Wednesday, it was decided to hold a dahlia parade on the last day of the county fair. It will be a county affair and ladies of the county are earnestly invited to take part in making this an attractive feature. The Queen of the Dahlia parade will be elected by votes from all parts of the county, and young ladies who wish to enter the contest should confer with the Women's Civic Improvement League of this city. ### TIMBER LAND WORTH \$5,000,000 TO BE SOLD.

Affairs of Defunct Tillamook County Concern Wound Up.

Timber land valued at more than \$5,000,000 and covered with 4,500,000 feet of the finest Douglas fir in the Willamette valley country will be transferred from the Tillamook Timber & Logging company to the First Trust & Savings bank, of Chicago, trustees for the bondholders of that corporation, under a decree of the United States district court, which Judge Bean will sign this afternoon.

The decree forecloses a mortgage for \$3,276,506, which swamped the company when, in September, 1915, it found itself unable to pay its taxes and the semi-annual interest of \$99,999 on its bonds. The land and timber, which are said to be worth much more than the amount of the mortgages, will be sold sometime near August 20 by Wallace McCamant, standing master in chancery. An attorney fee of \$15,000 is allowed the plaintiff's counsel, Littlefield & Maguire, of Portland, and Winston, Payne, Strong & Shaw, of Chicago, are the fortunate parties.

The decree, taken by default and consent, is probable the largest in point of value affected ever handed down by the local court, save only in cases of the Oregon & California land grant cases.

Practically all the land in Tillamook county, some lies in Washington and Lane counties. No mills are included. The action was begun last May.—Telegram.
