#### County Court is Unjust to Bayocean.

The County Court, it seems, has decided to take the money that was appropriated for the Bayocean road and to expend it in hardsunfacing roads in other parts of the county, thereby doing Bayocean a great in-justice, for it there is any place that is justly entitled to a road and a way out it is Bayocean. It is no secret that some of the timber men opposed the building of this road, and are doing so today, but there is a strong senti-ment in the county in favor of giving Bayocean a road, and it would have received it if Judge Gatens allowed the receiver for the Potter Realty Co. to go ahead with the proposition he made at the budget meeting.

Court appears to be somewhat divided. County Judge A. M. Hare and Commissioner F. L. Owens want to expend all of it on hard surfacing, while Commissioner G. R. McKimens is opposed to this, and when he ascertained what the county judge and the other commissioner and decided to do he filed a protest and asked to have

#### City Surveyor Resigns.

City Engineer Ross Shreve handed in his resignation Tuestay to take effect at once. This action of the city engineer resulted from the appoint ment, by the city council, of Council-man David O'Donnell of the first ward as inspector of concrete pave-

Shreve, who had charge of the work, oppointed an inspector who claimed to be experienced in concrete work, at a salary of \$75,00 per month. This appointment did not meet with the approval of the city dads, and at the meeting Monday night the inspector was removed and O'Donnell appointed in his place at \$4.00 per day. In his communication to the council Shreye says that O'Donnell is inexperienced in this work, and wholly incompetent to act

as inspector. Mayor Brodhead called a special session of the council Wednesday and Shreve's resignation was accepted and Harry P. Kerr was given the position of city engineer. O'Donnell was retained as inspector, although the council was advised by the city attorney that such action was contrary to the city charter which pro-vides that "No officer of the corpora-tion shall be interested in any contract, or work, the expenses of which are to be paid out of the city treas-

A petition is being circulated by the property owners effected by this improvement, protesting against O'Donnell's appointment.
