Tillamook Day at the Fair.

The Executive Board of the Tillamook Commercial Club instructed the president to appoint a committee to arrange a businessmen's parade for the opening day of the fair, and he appointed Attorney J. R. Callahan, Kay Walls and A. Ammer. The parade will be in the afternoon and Mayor Brodhead will request that all business houses be closed from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. and all business men are requested to take part in the parade as the opening day of the fair is Tillamook day. Governor Withycombe will probably be present and head the procession with the county and city officials. The businessmen are to be dressed in white duck pants, white shirts and white hats.

May—Total milk, 477,786 lbs.; total butter fat, 18,697 lbs.; total cheese, 53,972 lbs.; average test, 3.913 per cent; price received 38c.; cheese yield 100 lbs. milk, 11.29 lbs.; cheese yield per lb. butter fat, 2.88.

June—Total milk, 490,241 lbs.; total butter fat, 19,363 lbs., total cheese, 55,292 lbs.; average test, 3.96 per cent; price received 38.8c.; cheese yield 100 lbs. milk, 11.28 lbs.; cheese yield per lb. butter fat, 2.85.

Totals—lbs. milk, 1,340,665 lbs.; lbs. butter fat 51,991; total cheese 150,577 lbs.

Low Testing Milk.
April—93,895 lbs. milk; 3,234 lbs. butter fat; 9,468 lbs. cheese; 3,446 per cent test; price 41.3c.; yield 100 lbs. milk, 10.08; yield per lb. butter fat 2.92.

May—120,285 lbs. milk; 4,056 lbs. butter fat; 12,135 lbs. cheese; 3,372 per cent test; price 39.5c.; average yield 100 lbs. milk, 10.99 lbs.; yield per lb. butter fat 3.00.

June—125,010 lbs. milk; 4,266 lbs. butter fat; 12,592 lbs. cheese; test 3.410 per cent; price 39.5c.; yield 100 lbs. milk, 10.07 lbs.; yield per lb. butter fat, 2.95.

Totals—339,190 lbs. milk; 11,556 lbs. butter fat; 34,195 lbs. cheese. Higher testing milk shows average yield of 11.23 lbs. of cheese per 100 lbs. milk. An average of practically 2.90 lbs. of cheese was made per lb. butter fat, or 2.896.

The lower testing milk gives an average yield of 10.98 lbs. of cheese per 100 lbs. milk. The lower testing milk produced nearly 2.96 lbs. of cheese per lb. of butter fat. The net results of the experiment to date show that the higher testing milk with an average of 3.88 per cent butter fat produced 2.90 lbs. of cheese per pound of butter fat, against the lower testing milk with an average test of 3.407 per cent butter fat production of 2.96 lbs. per pound of butter fat.

Both showings are remarkable in the large per cent of cheese per lb. of butter fat. Last year's showing for the county was an average of 2.755 lbs. cheese per lb. butter fat.

Musters Gets a Good Send Off.

Munter, the Aviator, who is under contract to make flights at the Tillamook County Fair this month, delivers the goods. Hear what the directors of the Southeastern Idaho Fair at Blackfoot say in resolution adopted by them last fall:

Resolution—It is the sense of this meeting and all its members that the nine aerial flights by Prof. H. A. Munter during the four days of the fair just closed, have been the most pleasing and satisfactory attraction we have ever had in all the 14 years we have been operating this fair. From the time the machine was set up until it was again packed for shipment, we had only to express our wishes as to time, and the flights were made. We had no bother, no anxiety, no demands for anything, and he did not even come to us for money until his engagement was finished. All this is different from the unusual experience with aviators. We wish our aviation committee to renew engagement with Mr. Munter early for 1916 with the new modern airship he contemplates using next year.

"Aviator Munter made one of his most spectacular flights yesterday, ascending 3000 feet then suddenly made a dip almost vertically of 1000 feet. While ascending he took a birdseye view of the grounds with a camera at an altitude of 1000 feet and another at 2000 feet. He had planned to take another at 3000 feet but the altitude rendered objects indistinct and he did not make the photograph. While in the air he showered spectators with 5000 bits of paper on which the fair visitors were thanked for their enthusiasm and attendance and invited them to the fair next year.
