Promissory Notes and Politics.

F. R. Beals vs. M. A. Mead and T. B. Mead in which plaintiff sued to recover \$200,72, the defendants have filed a plea and abatement to the complaint, which says: "That on or about the 19th day of May, 1916, plaintiff and defendants made and entered into the following contract and agreement with respect to each of the promissory notes described in the complaint, to-wit: It was then and there agreed between the plaintiff and the defendants that if the defendant T. B. Mead would exercise his influence and give his time toward effecting the nomination of a certain friend and candidate of the defendant, the plaintiff, in consideration for said services and time given, as aforesaid, by the said defendant T. B. Mead would extend the payment of the said promissory notes to time when the said defendants could conveniently pay the same and would have the money without inconvenience to pay the same and until the defendants were fully able to make payments of said notes in cash. That in pursuit of said agreement the said T. B. Mead did give his time and services for a period of several days towards effecting the nomination of the said friend and candidate of the defendant, the plaintiff, and fully performed any and all services which he agreed to perform under the said agreement. That at the time of the filing of this action, and at this time, the defendants and each of them are unable to pay any portion of the said promissory notes, and have no money or funds with which to pay the same or any portion thereof, and the plaintiff at all times has well-known that the defendants are not able to raise the funds with which to meet the said payments." In reply to this the plaintiff denies each and every allegation contained in the defendants' plea and abatement.

Hughes in Oregon Next Week.

The Republican state central committee is making elaborate preparations to handle an immense throng on the occasion of the forthcoming visit of Charles E. Hughes, Republican candidate for President, who will speak in Portland on August 16, at 8 p.m. Mr. Hughes and his party of twenty-eight, including Mrs. Hughes, will reach Portland at 7 a.m. on the 16th.

The big meeting will be held either at the armory or at the ice hippodrome, at 20th and Marshall streets. The armory will accommodate 5000 people and the hippodrome 10,000 and if the latter building can be put in condition soon enough it probably will be used by the committee.

Mr. Hughes' schedule calls for stops in Oregon only at Portland, Medford, Ashland and Roseburg, but National Committeeman Williams and the State Committee will make an effort to have the schedule changed so as to give Salem, Albany and Eugene at least a few minutes each.

At the Portland meeting, State Chairman C. L. McNary will present Gov. Withycombe who will introduce Mr. Hughes.

Only the Hughes party and members of the state and county committees will have seats on the stage.
