> There is no denying the fact that in a few years the automobile travel in-to Tillamook will bring into the county more money than the dairy in lustry. The loop the loop will be one of the most attractive drives in Oregon. It may be a little premature to advocate, as was done at the banquet on Friday, that each county hard surface its part of the loop, for the reason that that is a most expensive undertaking. It would require at least \$750,000 and more, probably \$1,000-000 to hard surface the highway through Tillamook, which this coun ty is not prepared to expend at this time for that purpose. As we have often advocated, \$100,000 of the road fund should be expended every year for hard surfacing as soon as present road projects are completed. If other counties would build several miles of hard surfaced road every year, in a few years a large proportion of the loop would be hard surfaced.






