THEY PLAN TO ENLARGE THE PORT OF TILLAMOOK

Whole Bay Section, 125 Miles Square to be Included if Scheme Passes.

Petitions are to be placed in circulation this week praying for the enlargement of the bounndry scope of the Port of Tillamook, which at present comprises only the area occupied by the town.

If the proposal is ratified at a special election to be held the latter part of November the confines of the port will embrace a territory 125 miles square, making all the property therein taxable for harbor improvements.

R. B. Compton, attorney for the Port of Tillamook, says the petitions are being drawn up and will be ready for signatures in a few days.

According to Mr. Compton the assessed valuation of the property in the Port district will be increased from \$1,200,000 to about \$5,000,000 if the proposal meets with the approval of the voters.

The port authorities are anxious to deepen and widen the channel between Tillamook and Bay City. If they can get to a depth of 10 feet at the zero stage it is stated they would be satisfied for a while.

AGRICULTURAL NOTES. By R. C. Jones County Agriculturalist. Improved Live Stock. Mention was made in last weeks papers of a stock exhibit going to the state fair from this county.

For the next few weeks or so Mr. Ward will experiment a little to see if the methods used in other places can be used with equal success under local conditions, and, if found to be applicable, meetings will be arranged after that to demonstrate the best methods to use in annihilating the pest.
