

As a large number of business men and citizens in all parts of the county will be anxious to obtain the result of the presidential and state elections, we have made arrangements with the Western Union for a special wire and operator, which will enable the peo-ple of this city and county to obtain election news as soon as other parts of Oregon.

So as to make it convenient for the public, we have engaged the City Hall for their comfort and accommodation, where the result of the presidential, state and county elecion will be announced and bulletins

posted on blackboards. The special wire of the Western Union, with both local phones, will be located in the room now occupied by the commercial club, where we will have plenty of help, and the election news given out with as little delay as possible. This room will be

kept private. We have made this arrangement because in previous years people packed the Headlight office and the noise made it difficult to hear when figures were being received over the others, and for the reason that the city hall will afford plenty of accommodation, especially to the ladies who will be interested in election news.

We ask the co-operation of the election boards in obtaining partial counts, and whenever a representative of the Headlight asks for this it will only take a few moments-it will be of great benefit to us in giving out the news as to how the county

election is going. We will be glad to furnish the election news to all parts of the county, but where there are extra telephone charges this must be paid by those who call us up. In previous years we have had to pay out a good many dollars that way.
