Coast Artillery Company Gets Armory.
 Tenth Company, Coast Artillery Corps, O. N. G., has leased the quarters formerly occupied by the Commercial Club in the Tillamook building and will equip the rooms for its purposes. According to a statement from Major W. W. Wilson, acting adjutant general, uniforms and equipment for the company will be in Tillamook by November 20th. Lockers and gun racks will be installed in the main rooms and plotting board and materials will be placed in a room across the hall.

 HENRY TOHL PASSES AWAY.
 After a Lingering Illness at Nehalem On Saturday.
 Word was received in this city on Saturday that Henry Tohl, of Nehalem, had passed away after a lingering illness. Although no hope was entertained of his recovery, the end came somewhat suddenly as he was feeling a little better during the week.
 Henry Tohl was born in Germany in the year 1852. He came to Nebraska in 1879, after a short stay in Pennsylvania and engaged in farming for nearly five years. In 1884 he came to Oregon, settling in the Willamette valley, where he spent one summer. He then came to Tillamook county, making his way direct to Nehalem, and took up a homestead claim about a mile and a half east of the present town of Nehalem. Later he purchased the tract of land upon which the town is located, following the sale of the homestead. He early engaged in the mercantile business, founding the establishment now known as Tohl & Andersen.
 He was keenly interested in the welfare of the Nehalem valley in the development and upbuilding of the community in general. He took an active interest in all public enterprises, having served as vice-president of the Nehalem Port Commission to the time of his death.
 He died November 4th, at the residence of his sister, Mrs. Mary Effenberger, after a lingering illness, leaving two brothers and two sisters
