

WILSON WINS IN CLOSE RACE

Republicans Elect Entire Ticket in Tillamook County.

Great interest was centered in the presidential election from Tuesday to Thursday night when it was announced that President Wilson had been re-elected. There were several states that were close, the last of these being California, which went Democratic, and this decided the issue.

Oregon went Republican and Washington Democratic. The entire Republican state ticket was elected.

Tillamook County went Republican on Tuesday, giving Hughes a majority of 372 over Wilson, and the election of the entire Republican ticket.

Soon after six o'clock a great deal of interest in the presidential election developed. The Headlight had made arrangements for a special Western Union service and wire, which placed this city on a par with other cities in obtaining election news. Arrangements had also been made for procuring the vote in Tillamook county. The room now used by the Commercial Club in the City Hall was utilized for receiving election news, the special line of the Western Union and both phones being also installed. From six o'clock until five o'clock next morning the operator took election news, and this was read and posted in the city hall, where a large crowd gathered and remained all night. It was a good tempered crowd, made up of members of both political parties. Rollie W. Watson kindly performed the service of reading the election news, and when in favor of Hughes the Republicans clapped and when it favored Wilson the opposite side did the same.

In the county election, there were only three officers that the people are interested in—the district attorney, the sheriff and county commissioner. The early returns soon showed that the Republican candidates were in the lead, and this was increased as the local returns came in, and interest was soon lost in the county election with the exception of the size of the Hughes majority in the county.

Following is the official count of Tillamook County. The Headlight will give the entire vote of the county in precincts next week.
