National Forest Ranges are Heavy Stock Producers.
That the National Forest ranges in Northern Washington are among the greatest mutton and beef producers of any open land range in the country is indicated by reports from the Okanogan National Forest concerning the weights of sheep and cattle shipped from these ranges this year, recently received by District Forester George H. Cecil, Portland, Ore.
Shipments of the lambs direct from these ranges averaged from 92½ to 95 pounds at the stock yards, while one shipment of Roan Shorthorn Hereford steers averaged 1366 lbs. each with the shrinkage off. The average of the Okanogan Forest for top beef this season will exceed 1300 pounds.
The stock growers and the Forest Service cooperate through twelve local stock growers associations in the Okanogan country. The various problems of the stock business are threshed out at the association meetings, so that each member may profit from the experience of the others.
It is expected that in the near future only high grade bulls will be permitted on these ranges. Already a number of the associations have bought bulls, which are run on the range, each member paying a fee prorated according to the number of cows he turns out on the range.
The work of the Forest Service in organizing these local associations has led to the forming of a county Stock Growers Assn., with which all these local associations are affiliated.
The District Forester says that the Forest Service has been instrumental in organizing over sixty stock growers associations in Oregon and Washington, which has been recognized under National Forest regulations and are now actively co-operating with the Forest officers in their efforts to better stock and range conditions in the National Forests of the two states.
