The bone of contention was that America was selling ammunition to the allies while Germany was unable to procure the same, owing to an efficient blockade which Great Brit ian had placed around Germany, and she, in retaliation, declared certain areas of the sea around Great Britain doses. blockade areas and forbade shipping on the same, and this she had a per-fect right to do subject to the laws of

nations. And the laws of nations on this particular subject is that neutral ships going to a belligerent country may be stopped by another of the belligerents and searched and if munitions of war be found aboard same, or contraband goods of any character be found upon same, the ship may be seized and taken to the nearest port of the nation at war or being unable to take said vessel to port, the same may be destroyed, but however, the lives of the crew and

passengers must be safeguarded and the proper provisions taken to deliver them to the nearest port, they will be able to arrive at their destination at their earliest convenience. And to this declaration of the principles of international law Germany was a signer and was the first and only country to violate them during the present war. And further I might say that in the
