

**PATRIOTIC DEMONSTRATION ON THE FOURTH OF JULY**  
A Big Time in Tillamook City and a Big Parade.

Tillamook City will hold one of the biggest patriotic demonstrations on the Fourth of July ever held in the county next Wednesday and the spirit of patriotism will be the prevailing sentiment of the day, for this is one year of all others when the people of Tillamook County should get together and show their patriotism and their devotion to the flag and country. That is the principal reason why a big patriotic demonstration was arranged for in this city on the Fourth by the Tillamook Commercial Club, and to give every loyal citizen an opportunity to participate in the national event.

The patriotic demonstration will give the people of the county an opportunity of showing their appreciation of the Tillamook boys who have offered their services to the country, for the 10th Company Coast Artillery will be mustered in on the 13th of July, and two weeks after that date the company will entrain and prepare for active service in the great world wide war.

The demonstration will embrace a big parade, made up of the G. A. R., W. R. C., Spanish War Veterans, girls of the Honor Guard, Women's Civic Improvement Club, Business men, Grangers, etc. Miss Lillian Groat was elected Goddess, a local band will furnish the music and local talent will furnish the vocal music, and with everybody doing their "bit" to make the demonstration a success, with inspiring patriotic speeches, the National holiday will be fittingly observed in this city. There will be the usual sports in the afternoon for the young people.

Rollie W. Watson will be marshal of the day, and the demonstration will start promptly at 10 o'clock in the morning.

A full program will be published later.

Comrade C. E. Reynolds, who will command the G. A. R. and the W. R. C. on the Fourth, requests that the members of the drum and fife band, G. A. R. and W. R. C. assemble at the K. of P. Hall at nine o'clock on the morning of the Fourth, and he requests a full attendance.

Business houses are to close from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m.

Miss Lillian Groat is Goddess.

The subscribers to the patriotic demonstration elected Miss Lillian Groat goddess by a large number of votes. The committee had appropriated \$200 out of the funds for the expenses incurred on procuring suitable dress for the occasion, and Miss Groat gave the committee a pleasant surprise on Monday when she advised it to turn the \$200 over to the Company Fund.

Removal of Western Union Office.

The Tillamook Commercial Club entered a protest with the Public Service Commission against the removal of the Western Union office from the city to the depot, which will necessitate considerable inconvenience to those who use the Western Union. The Public Service Commission wired the Western Union in regard to the matter, and this is the reply received from J. N. Miller, Jr., the district commercial superintendent at Seattle:

"Referring to your telegram of the 21st instant relative to the contemplated action on the part of this company in closing our city office at Tillamook and arranging for the handling of commercial telegraph business through the Southern Pacific Co.'s station; I beg to explain that the Western Union Telegraph Co. has been called upon by the United States Government to furnish a large number of operators for active service in the signal corps and the certainty that these demands will greatly increase in the immediate future, renders it absolutely necessary for us to view the situation of general public communication from a

broad standpoint in the interest of making the best possible use of the operating talent available.

"Again, we are being called upon by the Government to establish and mobilization camps, etc. which necessarily involve the assignment thereto of a great number of operators who are thus removed in great service but these matters are of such prime importance as to call for no special comment.

"The present great shortage of operators which will continue to increase will, no doubt, necessitate the closing of a great number of city telegraph offices throughout the country, consolidating them as far as possible with the depot telegraph offices. While we appreciate the closing of the uptown office at Tillamook will entail some little inconvenience to the people of that town in the handling of their telegrams, I think you will agree that in the present situation calls upon every one to make sacrifices in the interest of the whole.

"The average number of messages sent to and received by the people of Tillamook does not exceed ten or twelve per day and the necessity for utilizing to the fullest extent the services of every operator in the country will hardly permit of the retention of the Tillamook City office in view of the fact that the operator's services are urgently needed in other quarters.

"The operator at the Southern Pacific Company's depot at Tillamook is quite prepared to take care of the telegraph business for the town in a prompt and satisfactory manner."

**BONDS WILL MATCH FEDERAL ROAD COIN**

State Supreme Court Upholds Bean-Barrett Law for Providing Funds

Salem, Or., June 26.—The Supreme Court today ordered the issuance of a preceptory writ of mandamus to compel the State Board of Control to issue a sufficient amount of bonds under the Bean-Barrett bill to meet the requirements of the Shackleford act in matching Government money for road purposes. By the decision the State Highway Commission wins its contention that the bonds under the Bean-Barrett bill are available for meeting the federal act without the use of other highway funds.

The court holds that none of the \$6,000,000 worth of bonds provided for under the issue voted by the people is to be used for matching the Shackleford funds, and also holds that the motor-vehicle fund is to be used in paying the principal and interest on road indebtedness, and consequently none of that fund is to be used in matching the federal money. In addition it is held that the moneys derived from the one-fourth of 1 mill tax for highway purposes, are to be used in taking care of old contracts made by the State Highway Commission and for the operation and maintenance of highways already constructed.

By pointing out how all of the highway funds shall be used the court holds that the matching of the Federal money shall be done through the Bean-Barrett bill.

"There can be no reasonable doubt," states the court, "that the sale of state bonds in an amount sufficient to raise enough of money to meet the appropriation for the year specified (referring to 1917) devolves upon the State Board of Control, the performance of which the law especially enjoins as a duty resulting from an office. L. O. L. Section 613.

The court refers to the negative argument by C. E. Spente, Master of the State Grange, and others, as it appeared in the voters' pamphlets and to a communication from J. D. Brown, of the Farmers' Union, in stating that such argument and letter strengthens its own conclusion.

**Notice of Intention to Improve Street in Tillamook City.**

Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern that the Common Council of Tillamook City, Oregon, did, on the 20th day of June, 20, 1917, adopt a resolution for the improvement of a street, in words, yetters and figures as follows, to-wit:

**Resolution and Notice of Intention to Improve a Certain Street in Tillamook City, Oregon.**

Be it resolved, That the Common Council of Tillamook City, Oregon, deems it expedient and hereby declares its intention to improve the following street in said city, to-wit:

Miller Avenue from the South side of Third Street to the north side of Fifth Street by establishing the grade of said street, by grading the same to proper grade, by rolling the roadway thereof, and by laying thereon a concrete roadway 24 feet in width, and 6 inches in thickness, and by building curbs, catch basins and laying drain pipes together with inlets and constructing laterals for sewer connections, and making provisions for the necessary surface drainage of said street, with all the appurtenances thereto.

All of said improvements to be made in accordance with the charter, resolutions and ordinances of Tillamook City, and in accordance with the plans and specifications and estimates of work thereof made and prepared by the City Engineer of Tillamook City, and filed in the office of the City Recorder of said city. All of said improvements to be made at the expense of the property, and all thereof adjacent thereto and especially benefited by said improvements within the limits of said district established and defined by this resolution.

Be it further resolved, that the plans, specifications and estimates for the proposed improvements so made and prepared by the City Engineer, the estimate of the probable total cost thereof being \$3,080.81 be and the same are hereby approved.

That the boundaries of the assessment district to be benefited by said improvements and assessed therefor are hereby established as follows:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of Lot 2 in Block 2 of A. A. Miller's Addition to the Town of Tillamook, now Tillamook City, and running thence South along the center line of Blocks 2 and 4 of said Miller's Addition to the South line of said Block 4; thence East along the South line of Block 4 and of Block 3 in said Miller's Addition to a point 105 feet east of the Southwest corner of said Block 3; thence North parallel with the West line of said district to a point in the North side of Block 1 of said Miller's Addition 105 feet East of the Northwest corner of said Block 1; and thence West to the place of beginning.

That said district shall be and is hereby designated as Local Improvement District No. 9, and all the property included within the district is described as follows:

Lots 1, 2, 7 and 8 in Block 2; Lots 1, 2, 7, and 8 in Block 4; also Lots 8 to 15 inclusive and 5 feet of the entire west side of Lots 7 and 16 in Block 1, and Lots 8 to 15 inclusive and 5 feet off the entire west side of Lots 7 and 16 in Block 3, all in said A. A. Miller's Addition to the Town of Tillamook, now Tillamook City.

Be it further resolved, That the City Recorder be and is hereby instructed to cause this resolution and notice to be published for three consecutive publications in the city official newspaper, That the Tillamook Headlight is designated as the city official newspaper for this purpose. That the City Engineer is directed to cause to be conspicuously posted at each end of the line of the proposed improvement a copy of this resolution and notice within three days of the date of the first publication thereof, and that all persons concerned be thereby notified of the date of the first publication of said notice, and that objections and remonstrances to the proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder within 20 days from said date.

All persons concerned are hereby notified that said resolution was duly adopted on the date aforesaid. That the first publication of this notice is made June 21, 1917, and that objections and remonstrances to the proposed improvement may be filed with the undersigned City Recorder within 20 days from said date.
