Over 100 Tons of Evergreen Blackberries Shipped Out.

Evergreen blackberries which for years have gone to waste in Tillamook County in previous years, were in demand this year, and for the first time were used in a commercial way. Over 100 tons were shipped out of the county, 80 tons of that amount being shipped from Tillamook City. They were shipped to different fruit packers, and put up in jelly or canned. The picking for the most part was done by women and children which brought them a large amount of pin money. The pickers receiving 3/4c.

per pound at the end of the season. There are enormous quantities of evergreen blackberries in Tillamook County, and now a start was made to ship them it is more than probable this will induce someone to locate here with a cannery.

Oregon received \$220,100 of rural credit moneys a few months ago. This was divided up among the counties. Marion county received \$9000 and Yamhill \$7100. The rest received \$6000 each. Since then the sum of \$120,950 has been loaned out to farmers, and there remains \$99,150. Yamhill, Wheeler, Lincoln and Harney counties have loaned all of their allotments. Columbia, Gilliam, Malheur, Morrow and Washington counties have loaned none of theirs.
