Editorial Snap Shots.

Portland is having about the same experience with juries as Tillamook had when the local option law went into effect. They would not convict with the most convincing evidence placed before them by the prosecuting attorney.

It is reported that too heavy loads are being hauled over the county and city paved roads. There is not a road in the county or city that will stand up under a 14 ton load, and the county and city officials should put a stop to it.

By way of a little charity and consideration, give the business men a rest for a few months. They have been called upon for money so frequently that packing around subscription appeals have become burdensome. Give the business men a rest in this matter.

Something will have to be done to round up the enemy in the United States. The United States have been exceedingly considerate of alien enemy, too much so, as the outrage in Wisconsin last Saturday proves, for although the bomb killed eight persons, it was intended to kill several hundred. This will help to bring hatred upon the people of the central powers and arouse righteous indignation in the United States. Stearn measures should be taken at once to round up all alien enemy, otherwise the destruction of life and property will continue.

Marshal Harris has handed in his resignation and Mayor Boals will have to appoint someone to fill the vacancy. There are three aspirants, Rev. C. C. Curtis, a man named Myers and M. E. Gruber. As the city affairs have been going along smoothly since the last special election, when an effort was made to "bottle up" the city on Sundays, compelling all stores to close up, there is some objection to Mr. Curtis on account of his taking an active part in the fight, and for the best interests of the city we consider it best to appoint a city marshal who has not antagonized the citizens in wanting to dictate how the city should be run. The best man as far as we are able to judge, is Mr. Gruber. He has had experience and is not biased or prejudiced and would make an excellent officer.

Preachers have their troubles as well as other people. And some of them bring trouble on themselves, when they undertake to butt in and want to dictate how a city should be run. We have had a large number of sincere, earnest preachers in this city, and the most successful preachers have been those who have refrained from interfering in city affairs, and who have devoted their time and energies to religious work. The snap shot man is inclined to believe that the preacher who has a congregation of only a dozen to twenty persons on Sunday, is not much of a success, yet we have had preachers of that kind who have started up local strife and trouble on account of their activity in city affairs. We have in mind some very successful preachers who came to Tillamook some few years ago who gained the respect of the citizens. They were imbued with the true Christian spirit and the brotherhood of mankind. They never spoke ill of anyone or other denominations and thought it a duty they owed the community to give the glad hand and a cheerful word of encouragement to people they met every day, whether they belonged to some other church, or did not attend church at all. There was nothing spectacular or emotional about their religious work, did not resort to sensational revivals nor show pictures on Sunday to attract a congregation, nor did they run their church with a series of socials to hold the church together, but preached good common sense, sound religious sermons, never claiming that theirs was the only church. They won the respect and admiration of church goers as well as non-church goers, and it was a loss to the city when they departed. But not so the preacher who dabbled in city affairs directly he arrives here. When it comes to their turn to leave, no one regrets their departure. We remember, not long since, when almost every business man in the city signed a petition for a certain thing, but the preachers thought they knew best how to run the city and undertook to defeat it. They not defeat, our reason being that people resented their interference because they were considered transients and had no property interests here. To our own way of thinking there is plenty of other work for preachers to do than to dabble into city affairs and stir up trouble, especially those who preach to empty pews on Sunday.
