#### Gospel Meetings Begin at the United Brethren Church.

Last Sunday night, conducted by Elder G. R. Eads, Baptist missionary for Oregon, the opening sermon was taken from the Prophecies of Daniel, second chapter, showing that Nebuchadnezzar's great image represented the four great world kingdoms and that the toes of the image are the European powers that are now at war.  
 Monday night the prophecies of Daniel, seventh chapter, was taken up and the great events of the world's history brought down to the present time in the development of Germany as the "Little Horn", of Dan. 7:8-26.  
 Tuesday night, the sermon was taken from Ezekiel, 38th chapter, dealing with the imminent return of the Jews to Palestine, and the war that shall then be waged against them by "Mayog" (Russia) and the nations that shall then be allied with them.  
 These sermons are very interesting and the interest is increasing.  
 The meetings will continue at 7:30 each evening this week, if interest sufficient will continue next week. Come and hear Dr. Eads and you will be well paid for your trouble.  
 I wish to say this meeting is no opposition meeting gotten up by the United Brethren or us at the Nazarine. We had arranged with the United Brethren for their house to hold this meeting in nearly three months ago. So if you are not attending the Nazarine, come to the United Brethren church.  
 Keep Healthy by Eating Less Sugar.  
 The reason for the shortage of sugar is easily found. In normal times Germany and Austria export about two and a quarter million tons of sugar a year. They export none now. The invaded parts of France and Belgium are large sugar producers normally. The United States is exporting almost twenty times the amount of sugar exported before the war.  
 We consume, under normal conditions according to the American Food Journal, 90 pounds of sugar per year per person. We read that our government has put us on a sugar allowance and we are to be reduced to an allowance of 35 pounds a year. The various nations of Europe have been put on even a shorter allowance. The government is advising the use of such sugar substitutes as glucose, honey, molasses and maple syrup.  
 At a recent fat stock show lecturers from agricultural colleges demonstrated methods cooking fruits without the addition of sugar. They
