MOSEY OUT FOR GOVERNOR

Was President of the Oregon State Senate at the Last Session of the Legislature.

Gus C. Moser, president of the Oregon State Senate, made public announcement of his candidacy for the Republican nomination for Governor at the coming primary election which will be held on May 17, 1918. While it has been quite generally understood for some months that he would be such candidate, it was only today that he made his definite announcement.

Senator Moser was a candidate for the same nomination four years ago, when there were eight republican candidates in the race, four of whom were from Multnomah county and two from Oregon City. Notwithstanding the divided vote, he carried Multnomah county by nearly four thousand plurality, and stood second in the state as a whole. When he found that Governor Withycombe had defeated him for the nomination, he invited the six other defeated candidates to his office and organized them into what was afterwards known as "The Harmony Club," and this club was largely instrumental in Governor Withycombe's election over Dr. C. J. Smith, the Democratic nominee.

Mr. Moser has been a member of the State Senate for the past six years and has had a leading part in all constructive legislation enacted during that period. He was chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee at the 1913 and 1915 sessions, and was unanimously elected president at the 1917 session, which position he now holds. He takes pride in his record as a legislator, as well as in the work he has done through civic and other organizations, and submits his record to the people of the state for their approval, by giving support to his candidacy. His announcement is as follows:

"In submitting to the people of the State of Oregon my candidacy for the republican nomination for Governor, I am not unmindful of the responsibility which rests upon the occupant of that high office at all times, and more especially now, when this Nation, with its Allies, is engaged in the most gigantic struggle the world has ever known, in order that Democracy may live and human liberty survive; and in order that the principles, enunciated by our Revolutionary Fore-Fathers in the immortal Declaration of Independence, may come to prevail in every civilized nation of the world.

"Nor am I unmindful of the great aid which a Governor may give, and which, if elected, I shall give to the very utmost of my power and ability, to the National Administration in bringing this war to a speedy and victorious conclusion.

"Nor do I forget the honors which have been conferred upon me by my constituents in Multnomah County, where I live and where my work is best known. For six years I have served in the State Senate, and at the last election was returned by a greatly increased plurality. I have served faithfully, honestly, and to the best of my ability, and I now submit to the people of the state of Oregon, my candidacy for a high and broader field of endeavor. If the record I have made as an official, and as a citizen of this state, appeals to you, may I ask you to give me your support? If you have not always agreed with me, will you give me credit for having done what in my judgment as God gave me light to see, was right? And if our views differ in some of the issues in this campaign, will you give me the benefit of your views, and will you listen to and consider mine?"

"Within a few weeks I shall promulgate in detail my platform or declaration of principles, but I deem it appropriate to refer at this time to a few of the cardinal principles for which I shall stand, and which, if elected, I hope to carry into effect:

(1) First and foremost is the war problem, to which I have already referred. We must give our undivided and best efforts to bringing about a speedy victory, and in doing this, let us remember that it has now developed into a question of food and other supplies, as much as a question of men to fight the battles. There should not only be the strictest conservation, but every encouragement should be given to increased production. Our shipbuilding, aeroplane stock, and every other war industry, as well as our agricultural developments and production, should be encouraged in every possible way, and a strict program of conservation and economy must be carried into effect in the administration of every department of

the state.

(2) When the war is over we must be prepared for the re-adjustment that will be necessary, and calm, cool, calculating heads must work it out. An extension of our rural credits legislation, and some definite colonization scheme to make productive our vacant lands, will, in my judgment, be of great benefit.

(3) Useless Boards and Commissions must be abolished. This may sound like an old political "battle cry," but I believe in it thoroughly, and the record of the Senate at the last session shows that we passed a considerable number of bills abolishing and consolidating various Boards and Commissions, but with one exception, they failed of passage in the House.

(4) Labor and capital must be brought together under the scheme of mutual co-operation, instead of mutual antagonism.

Senator Moser was born at Alma, Wisconsin, of Swiss ancestry, on November 15th, 1870, and is, therefore, 47 years of age. He was educated in the common and high schools of Wisconsin, and at college at Valparaiso, Indiana. He came to Oregon nearly 27 years ago, and has lived in Portland ever since. He was admitted to the Bar of Oregon on June 1, 1894, and has since practiced his chosen profession. He has been active in civic, business and other organizations, and has always been known as an "Oregon Booster." He has always been a loyal Republican, and has campaigned the State in every Presidential election since 1892, for the Republican National ticket. He is married and lives at 358 Thirteenth Street, Portland, Oregon.

STANFIELD IN THE FIGHT

Successful Business Man and Farmer Aspires to be U. S. Senator.

Stanfield, Ore., Jan. 1.—That he will be his own campaign manager, and have neither headquarters nor assistants but will depend upon the news and advertising columns of the press of the state and personal visits to reach the voters, was the announcement of R. N. Stanfield to-day in assuming the active work of his campaign for the nomination of United States senator on the Republican ticket.

He declared he intended to make
