## NEW I.O.O.F. LODGE INITIATED AT WHEELER.

### Over Two Hundred Oddfellows Join in the Work and Have Big Fraternal Time.

What will no doubt prove to be the "liveliest" Odd Fellows lodge in Tillamook County was organized at Wheeler, the thriving and prosperous metropolis of the north end on last Thursday night, January 17th.

Never before in the history of the county has such a successful and fraternal gathering predominated. All of the greater and lesser lights of Odd Fellowship were here gathered, from the tyro who is on his way, to the Past Grand, Past Chiefs and Masters of the intricate workings of the order.

The preliminary work of organization having been perfected by Deputy District Grand Master, S. A. Brodhead during the day, all that remained to be done during the night session was the initiation of the large class by the various degree teams and the installation of the appointed officers to complete the organization of the "baby lodge" of Oregon and of Tillamook County, which is strated out a very husky infant.

The special train from Tillamook carried the Cloverdale, Beaver, Tillamook and Bay City brothers to their destination arriving in time to open lodge promptly at 7:30 in the hall of the Union cannery where fine quarters had been previously arranged. ## NOTICE TO GERMAN ALIENS.

### All German Aliens are Required to Register 4th to 9th February.

By proclamation of the President of the United States, all Germans are hereby notified that all natives, citizens, denizens, or subjects of the German Empire or Imperial German Government, being males of the age of fourteen years and upwards on registration day, who are within the United States and not actually naturalized as American citizens, are required to register as alien enemies.

The dates of registration, within the state of Oregon, have been fixed by the Attorney General of the United States to commence at 6 a.m. on February 4th, and to continue on each day successively thereafter between the hours of 6 a.m. and 8 p.m. up to and including the 9th day of February, 1918, at 8 p.m.

All German aliens residing or being within the city and County of Tillamook are hereby required to present themselves for the registration at the nearest post office to the Postmaster, who has been designated by the Attorney General as Assistant Registrars, and to complete their registration on or before the 9th day of February, 1918, at 8 p.m.

Any German alien, required to register, who fails to complete his registration within the time fixed therefore, or who violates, or attempts to violate any regulation duly promulgated by the President of the United States, or these Regulations, in addition to all other penalties prescribed by the law, is liable to restraint, imprisonment and detention for the duration of the war, or to give security, or to remove and depart from the United States in the manner prescribed by law.

Forms of registration affidavits, registration cards, and instructions to registrants, and other necessary forms will be furnished by Postmasters.
