Gentlemen—In accordance with your request we enclose herewith list of Third Liberty Loan subscribers received by us to date.

The Wheeler Lumber Company have pledged for some \$20,000.00 of subscriptions from their employees, but they have been unable to get these into proper shape on account of the fact that subscription blanks were not furnished us until Saturday, April 6th.

Practically all of this list and the \$20,000.00 of the Wheeler Lumber Company's employees subscriptions were pledged before last Saturday, making a total of approximately \$85,650.00. As our quota was but \$9,000.00 this was over 900 per cent "over the top" the first day. Owing to the failure of the government to supply us with proper forms in time, some of this has not reached headquarters yet, which accounts for the poor showing in the Oregonian. We believe had we been properly supplied with subscription blanks and with the daily report forms, etc., that the banks were asked to use, Wheeler district would have been the first in Oregon to win the "Honor flag." As it is now we have not been allowed it yet, in spite of the fact that telegrams were sent to headquarters Friday evening at ten o'clock stating the amount pledged at that time. Some of the forms the banks are supposed to use in making reports have not yet reached this bank.

About War Claims.

The chairman of the local Legal Advisory Board has received the following letter:

Treasurer Department, Washington, March 26, 1918.

The American Bar Association desires to cooperate with the Treasury Department in combating illegal and reprehensible activities on the part of certain claim agents, pension attorneys and other persons in seeking to obtain employment in connection with the collection or preparation of claims under the War Risk Insurance Act.

There is no necessity for the employment of claim agents or attorneys for the collection of the benefits granted by the War Risk Insurance Act because the process of such collection is exceedingly simple and the Bureau of War Risk Insurance stands ready to render any and all assistance required. A great service can be rendered by making these facts clear to the dependents of soldiers and sailors who are being approached by unscrupulous persons. The suggestion of the American Bar Association that the patriotic lawyers of the country

advise claimants free of charge of their rights under the law is deeply appreciated by the Treasury Department and affords a splendid opportunity for service to the nation and to the men who are facing the fire of battle for us.

I earnestly hope that you and your associates will respond to the enclosed appeal.
