It was alleged that Percy Fineout not only refused to buy stamps but was charged with making disparaging remarks about the American Government and its system. It is said he failed to buy liberty bonds, though he is

making a daily wage of \$6 As the 200 workmen were leaving the mill yards Fineout was again approached by a girl solicitor for the stamp campaign. When he refused to buy or pledge himself he was seized by his fellow workers and started for the water front, where he was promised a chance to immitate a Hun sub marine. The waterfront was lined with indignant workmen and the way in which he was forced toward the dock soon convinced the victim that he wanted to buy war savings stamps and lots of them.
