NEWS OF TILLAMOOK BOYS. Tom Coates Jr., Heard From.

June 18, 1918. Dear Papa:-Here come another letter in pencil again. The last time I was where I could get it, I got a bunch of "Y" paper, otherwise I could not even write at all now. I might write this from inside of a dugout, but since the sun is out, and there is not a terrible lot of danger form Bosh shells at present I am out

These dugouts are some places, They vary in size from small ones which may hold only three or four men, to very large ones which may hold, it is claimed, a thousand men. The large ones are full of rooms and passages, and one needs a guide if he is to wonder about without getting lost. They are all depths under the ground too, from only a foot, down. About the only things which seem to enjoy living in them are rats and lice, but one can be sure of finding plenty of these. The rats are almost as big as dogs, and just as about a. tame as many dogs. But I guess it is good to have these inhabitants, because we never have to feel like strangers when we move from one dugout to another. We always get a

It doesn't make any difference where we are, we always have a good time, and as long as shells are not actually falling around us, they are the least of our troubles. For example, the other day, while we were back of the front lines a couple of; kilometers, one of the fellows found a swing in one of the trees. I wo or three of the buch ran for that. Then another found what looked like it might have been part of a one man tank, and proceeded to amuse himself with that. The rest of us who were not busy with something else continue to look for "cooties," (the everlasting amusement)' and argue as to which of us had the largest.

There is only one thing that we are reluctant to play with, or rather we investigate everything we run arcoss with one exception, and that one thing is a "dud"-or uexploded shell and there are lots of them lying around. They are too apt to go off to make it exactly safe to fuss with,

About all we have to do now is to eat and sleep, and guard, but sometimes we even have to work. The dugouts are fine for everlasting sleep for they are always dark, and when there are electric lights, the lights are more apt to be on in the night than in the day.

Some amusing things happen some times, even here where unexpected things happen. The other day a bunch of us were out digging trench es up in the woods, when all at once a big gun went off just behind 1 and the shell whistled over heads Now such a thing as a shell passing over will not bother anybody, but this shot came in the midst of a quiet, and not one of us knew that there was a gun anywhere near. Some of those in the trench jumped out, ad those out jumped in. One fellow started tearing down the trench for a couple of steps, and then caught himself and one of the bunch jumped out of the ditch and crowded along side of a little tree about four or five inches through.

Of course all this happened in aid instant, and then all was as though nothing had happened-but the ineident served for a few jokes anyway. It is the first shock that "gets" a fellow anyway. What is going on all the time is not greatly noticed. One is pretty apt to duck at the first shot but after that you feel comparatively

Billy Anderson Writes Home.

France, June 21, 1918. Dear George.-No noubt you will be much surprised to hear from me, but I know that you would be interested in things over here. I can't tell you where I am, but I am very near the Huns. I can near those guns plain enough to convince myself that I am pretty close.

I have been over the ground where a great battle was fought and found many interesting granades, gas bombs, and scharpnel etc. The old Evening, Community singing . . . The

wire entanglements are still there but pretty well shot to pieces. The soil over here is a mixture of clay and white soft stone.

They use two wheeled carts alto-gether for commercial use, and all Afternoon—prelude, Schubert Serekinds of transportation. We stay in huts with a ground floor, double Lecture, "Physical Training" decks for bunks. George Blanchard is only about 8 kilometers from here, Evening-Prelude ... Mother Goose and I only found it out yesterday also George Crimins. I have to go and stand retreat now, so will finish this when I come back. The trees over here are very small hardly any over 12 inches in diameter. I am sure longing for a good look at the old Oregon timber, and the rivers too.

Am sending a picture taken in a small village here in Frace. Some of the boys are from Maine, and some from Oregon.

Can handle French money all right now but not the French language very well. Southern France is a very beautiful place, but I don't like the northern part very well.

The streets in the Frechh villages and cities are very narrow and most of them are paved with cobblestone. I have visited many old churches seven or eight hundred years old, and some have been shelled by the Huns. A girl eighteen years old looks like she is almost 30. They have to work in the fields, and, in fact, more women work in the fields than men, see women firing locomotives in a


