Miss Hickey, of the music department has her class work in orchestra and glee club well organized, and in working condition, and the High School congratulates itself on securing so capable a teacher. Miss Bond of the commercial department has to date enrolled about 75 students in her department, and on Wednesday night organized her night class which will meet on Wednesday and Friday night at 7:30 until further notice be given.
