**SANITATION.**

That the germ is the cause of most deadly disease is more than mere theory—it is a real fact. 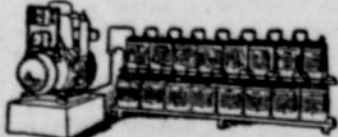
