

THE BEAST OF BERLIN QUITS THE HUN THRONE.

War Ends Suddenly When Germany Signs Armistice—Kaiser Flees To Netherlands.

Early Monday morning telephone essages were received in this city that Germany had signed the armistice and that the Kaiser and the Crown Prince had suddenly left Germany and had gone to the Netherlands for safety.
