The State Highway Commission in conjunction with the County Court doing business under the style and of Tillamook County, petitioned the Department of Agriculture that the Three Rivers road, from Hebo to the Sour Grass road, be graded 24 feet wide and surfaced 16 feet wide with waterbound macadam. The present
