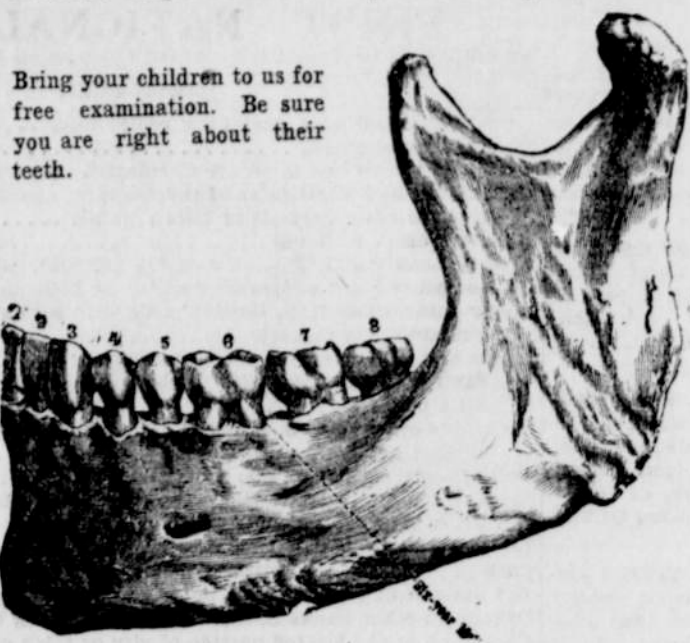

**The German Whiners.**

Chancellor Ebert, at the opening of the German national assembly protested against the "unheard-of and ruthless" armistice terms imposed upon Germany. "We warn our opponents not to drive us to the uttermost," he exclaimed. "Hunger is preferable to disgrace and deep privation is to be preferred to dishonor." The German is recovering his effrontery. The Hun is unique in his psychology. He never can see himself as others see him or dream of applying to himself the rules which he applies in his conduct toward others.

Would Germany have imposed "ruthless terms" and "wage slavery" on the allied nations if she had won the war? The answer is to be found in the peace conditions which she forced on the two entente powers which she did conquer—Russia and Rumania.

**Russia Ruined by Bolshevist Terrorism.**

Bolshevist defenders in this country, while admitting that Russia is in dire straits under soviet government, assert that reports of atrocities and tyranny are exaggerated. But statements by the American minister to Rumania, who, as he says, has been observing events in Russia as from a nearby watch tower are official evidence that the Russian situation has not yet been grasped by the world in its full horror and iniquity. We are told by our minister that—

"Wholesale execution and famine have reduced Moscow's population by 900,000. As part of the plan to exterminate the bourgeoisie the bolsheviks in the middle of January massacred 500 children in the town of Glnkov, near Kiev. One form of torture commonly practiced on men and women guilty of belonging to the upper and middle classes is to strip them naked and force them into the snow up to their necks. During the last five months more than 16,000 persons have been persecuted without trial in Moscow alone. In the big cities only the bolsheviks get food, all the others being left to starve. Compared with the reign of mad terror in Russia what we have seen elsewhere is paradise." Russia bolshevism is massed insanity. It is bedlamite government—a horrible mixture of low cunning,

vindictive cruelty, official greed, rapacity and inefficiency. Crack-brained and victorious men and women who are preaching it in this country are touting darkness against light, tyranny against liberty, ignorance against intelligence, fiendishness against humanitarianism and craziness against sanity.—Spokesman Review.

**It's Queer, Isn't It?**

It seems queer that there should persist anywhere in the country the slightest practice of confidence in the good faith of a party leadership which declared in its national platform of 1912:

"We demand a return to that simplicity and economy which befits a democratic government and a reduction in the number of useless offices, the salaries of which drain the substance of the people."

And in its 1916 platform: "We demand careful economy in all expenditures for the support of the government;"

And then "look what they went and done."

**"The Prodigal Son."**

In a class of seven students at the university not one had ever heard of the parable of the Prodigal Son. This is remarkable, seeing that this is one of the pieces of biblical literature which has had great vogue in non-religious circles. The theme also has figured so largely in art, music and secular literature that one might suppose an average young man had heard about the story, even if not clear as to its origin.

That young people are not a present familiar with the scriptures must be admitted. In part this is due to a decline—and one might say the disappearance—of the custom of holding family prayers night and morning, at which a chapter or more of the bible always was read. It was also the former custom to require young folks to commit a certain number of verses in the Bible to memory every day or week, with varying rewards for such achievements. These things are of the past.

A college graduate who does not know his Bible well, even if he is an atheist, has not even the foundations of a liberal education. No matter how one looks at this book, its influence on humanity in the last 2600 years has exceeded that of any other, and almost all of other influences combined. The part of the human race which concerns us more came to its development largely through Hebrew thought upon which Christianity was engrained. Not to know the Bible is a confession of ignorance and an exhibition of stupidity.

Arthur Buzzbrain says the little thieves get arrested and the big thieves get away. And just to think this is after six years of the "new freedom" as administered by the friends of Buzzbrain and the "common people."

Some men who ridicule the constitution written by Washington, Hamilton and Madison would have us accept with due reverence, humility and tongue-tied acquiescence the products of the constructive genius of Colonel House and his colleagues.

Douglas Fairbanks, the high jumper of the movies, says the constitution of the league of nations should be taught in the public schools. Every time Doug Fairbanks talks politics he makes everybody think what a great statesman Charles Chaplin must be.

Senator Hitchcock says the American people must now choose between the proposed league of nations plan and war. Recalling the advertisements printed by the Democratic national committee thirty months ago: "You must now choose between Wilson and peace and Hughes and war."

Foreman of the Hog Island ship yard, who struck for higher pay and returned to work pending decision of their demands, accepted the compromise increase in wages offered by Charles Piez, director general of the Emergency Fleet Corporation. Two classes of foremen, one of whom received \$64 weekly and the other \$52, were offered new rates of \$66 and \$54 with other concessions.

The Chicago Daily News thinks mushy sentimentalists may mourn over the deportees, but they should go, just the same. It says: "Mushy sentimentalists may shed tears over the fate of those poor dreamers and radical reformers. But they richly deserve their fate. They foolishly imagine that the United States could not or would not take proper measures to protect itself. They were aliens and therefore guests in this country. They chose to defy our laws to rail and scoff at our system of government and to preach violent insurrection and Bolshevism. They must learn that no democratic nations worthy of the name will tolerate such conduct on the part of the aliens. If the country does not suit them they can leave it."

**What a Long Tail Our Cat Has Got!**

In an address delivered at the White House to the members of the Democratic national committee (politics being adjourned) President Wilson declared, it is said, that the senators who are opposing his plan for a league of nations are pigmy-minded. Well, when a man who a few years ago was applying for a pension from the Carnegie fund for superannuated college professors gets to eating off gold dishes with the King in Buckingham Palace, any ordinary American United States Senator must seem to him to be small potatoes—and few in a bill.

**The New Freedom Is Here.**

David Lawrence, an administration press agent, says the Senate will have to accept whatever treaty is drawn up at Paris, without amendment. Some of the administration's press agents do not seem to get it through their heads that the famous rubber stamp Congress is over and done, and that the Senate is likely to assert its constitutional right and duty by having something to say in this matter. And there are those who would trust elected representatives of the American people, about as well as they would trust the representatives of the courts of Europe and Asia.
