BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF TILLAMOOK CITY, OREGON, AS FOLLOWS: Section 1. That Section 5 of Article VII of the Charter of Tillamook City, Oregon, as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby amended so that the same shall read as follows: Section 5. 


