ROOSEVELT HIGHWAY HAD MAJORITY OF 27,870 IN STATE.

Tillamook Made Record for Unselfishness and Progressiveness, Says Oregon Voter.

The Roosevelt Highway measure was the most popular of all the measures that were voted upon at the special election last month. There were 56,966 votes cast for it and 29,150 against, giving it a majority of 27,816 votes. Below we give the official figures:

The Oregon Voter gave an interesting analysis of the voting in each county, with some very pertinent remarks about some counties, especially as to Douglas, which is characterized as the "meanest county in Oregon," for that was the only county in the state that gave an adverse vote on all the measures. There is a marked difference in regard to this county, for it is recorded that "Tillamook made a record for unselfishness and progressiveness second to none other county considering the heavy vote cast." This is what the Voter says:

Headlight and Handley Commended "Tillamook—Heads the list for entire state for proportion of registered voters getting to polls—70 per cent.

Roosevelt Highway enthusiasm and a local bond issue for \$430,000 re-to one; Roosevelt Highway seventeen to one; other road measures five to one; irrigation guarantee five to one although Tillamook county can never hope to get any direct benefit from it; vote for irrigation guarantee was heavier than that cast for same measures by any Eastern Oregon county; two-thirds majority for reconstruction bonds and Portland industrial hospital for which latter evidence of friendliness this city is warmly appreciative; Tillamook made a record for unselfishness and progressiveness second to no other county considering the heavy vote. We are somewhat inclined to credit the Tillamook Headlight and Senator Handley for effective campaigning that made the creditable result possible. The Headlight gave more space to election issues than any other newspaper in Oregon outside of Portland, and more space in proportion to its size than any newspaper except the Voter.

To make the above complete, and to give credit where credit belongs, the names of H. H. Rosenberg and W. G. Dwight should be added for these gentlemen did splendid work also to put the measure over the top.
