THE COUNTY FAIR WAS BIG SUCCESS.

The Live Stock Exhibit at the County Fair.

The 1919 County Fair was the best in the history of Tillamook County, judged from the standpoint of the live stock exhibits. One hundred and fifty head of dairy cattle, including the Holstein, Jersey and Guernsey Breeds were on exhibition and there was not a poor individual in the bunch.

The Holstein and Jersey breeders were out in force, having about an equal number of each breed on exhibition. The Guernsey breed was represented by only four breeders. All the breeders are to be complimented on the preparation of their exhibits and on the neatness and attractiveness of the exhibits as a whole. There were very few animals shown that had not been prepared for the show, with a great deal of grooming and work. The judges made very complimentary remarks about the condition of the stock and of the exhibits in general.

Competition was very keen in the Holstein and Jersey classes, and many of the classes were composed of eight or ten animals that would have been a credit to any stock show in the state.

The aged Jersey bull, and the aged Holstein cow classes were especially interesting and close. Several old breeders from other parts of the state were profuse in their praises of the show. In get of sire the Holstein breeders had five entries and to the bystander it looked like anybody's prize until the ribbons were placed.

Prof. Brandt, of the Dairy Dept of O. A. C., judged the Holstein and Guernseys, while "Uncle Bill" Schuhench, of Hillsboro, placed the ribbons on the Jerseys, and both seemed to give excellent satisfaction.

The barns were in the best shape that they have ever been, for which the Fair Board and the live stock superintendent should receive the hearty thanks of the breeders.
