Various devices have been installed by railroads in order to avoid Allan A. McRea, Minister crossing accidents. These devices consist of crossing bells, gates, and towers. These mechanical devices, however, may at the critical moment fail. The crossing flagman, too, is only human and may err the same as the rest of us. So, while these precautions will be taken, it is safest for the automobile driver to augment these methods by his own care. In many instances crossing gates have been run into and watchmen have been run down at crossings.

The best and safest way for the automobile driver is to use the utmost precaution in negotiating a railroad crossing. He should put his Tillamook, car into second speed, allowing plenty of power in the engine.
