

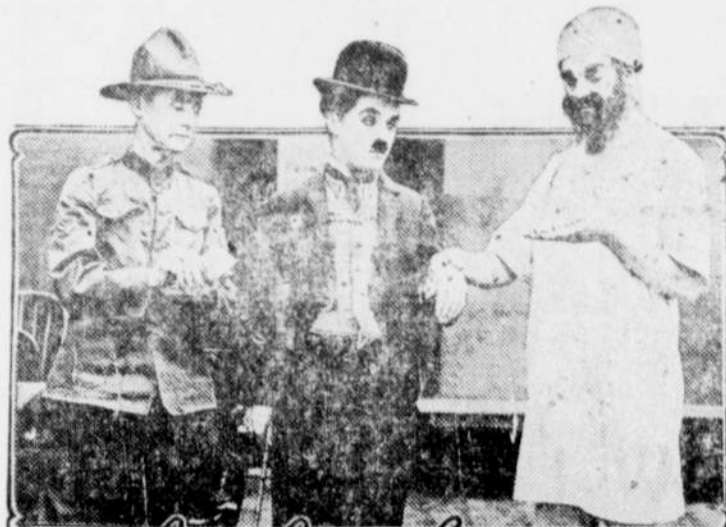

HIGH SCHOOL NOTES.

Why Do We Need a Gym?

People all over the country are beginning to realize more and more the need of a good school and community gymnasium. The state legislature passed a bill requiring 100 minutes of physical education every week. Why did they pass this bill? One of the reasons is that schools are lacking improperly adjusted school seats, 50 per cent of all the nervous strain among the pupils is caused by these seats and in order to overcome this strain, gymnasiums are needed.

Do you know that 38 per cent of the drafted men could not pass the physical examinations required upon entering the army or navy? 60 per cent of these men could have entered had they had proper physical corrective exercise when they were going to school.

Tillamook school district No. 9 has an assessed valuation of \$3,112,815, and Tillamook City is assessed at \$1,110,000, approximately \$6,000 or \$1,000 every year for 6 years would be the tax on this city property, a raise of one mill. If a person now pays \$15 his tax would be raised about \$1.20 for six years.

Twenty of Oregon's largest towns have an average of 9.1 mills for their school tax, Tillamook has only a 4.1 mills school tax. The Tillamook public schools only get 33 mills out of every dollar of tax that is taken in this district. In Bend the schools get 59 mills on every dollar of tax.

The music period on Monday was taken up by Supt. Turnbull. He gave some startling facts about the gymnasium and an architect's sketch of the proposed gymnasium was put on display.

On Monday evening there was a short student body meeting calling for volunteers for a house to house campaign Wednesday evening. It was also announced that a prize would be awarded to the class who had the best sayings or maxims printed on paper pennants for the Gym rally Thursday.

Tuesday noon Miss Skidmore, our household administration teacher, gave a talk on the gymnasium and then the students showed their pent-up enthusiasm by giving class yells and serpentine around the auditorium.

Miss Mauryce Curry, formerly an English teacher in T. H. S. is visiting for a few days with friends in Tillamook. Miss Curry resigned her position as a teacher here last fall and she is now taking up Americanization work. This work has taken her to New York city and back again.
